Stockholders vote to convert CTC to a nonprofit

At their Special Meeting held on October 6th, the CTC Stockholders voted overwhelmingly to convert the company to a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit corporation.

The next step in the process is to apply to the IRS to approve the 501 (c) (3) designation. If approved, the shares held in the corporation will become donations to the nonprofit. Stockholders will receive notice of the value of their donations at the time of conversion. The conversion to nonprofit has been discussed for many years. Acquiring the designa-

tion will provide the company several advantages including; tax exempt status, ability to receive tax exempt donations, and the ability to apply for some federal and other grants. Many thanks to all those who helped us locate stockholders and who have supported us in this process!
