The profit from charter and cruise services helps CTC make investments in our assets and supports our ferry and bus services. Our most important jobs—from a revenue standpoint—are Navy charters. In 2011 and 2012 we performed four such charters - 2 in Rockland, 1 in Camden, and 1 in

Boothbay - transporting crew and tourists to and from the Navy ship. The charters last several days and we work from 6AM to 2AM everyday. Meanwhile, the crew left at home must cover shifts for the 6 charter crew members. Why do they keep asking us back? Because we provide excellent service! Not only do we safely transport the crew and tourists—we clean the rust stains on their ship and repair their floats!
